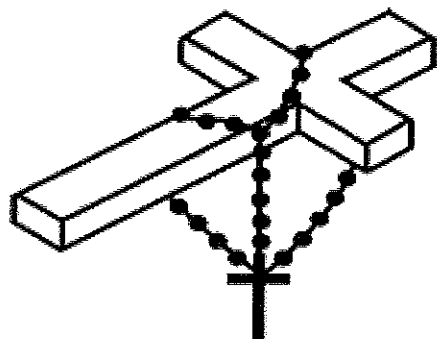

## Misunderstood Concepts by Br. Mark Orcutt, O.S.B.

A number of years ago, out in San Francisco, there was a columnist, Herb Caen (1916-1997) who bylined a column entitled "Unclear on the Concepts". An example of some of the topics he wrote on were things like "the Committee to Stamp Out Alcoholism will be having a cocktail party next Friday evening". The Apostles also had some misunderstood concepts concerning Jesus' teachings when it came to "greatness", "suffering", "the Kingdom" and the Church's part in the Kingdom.

An example of this occurred a few weeks ago when Jesus was explaining He was going to be crucified and the Apostles began arguing over who would be the "greatest in the Kingdom." They were unclear on Jesus' concept of greatness (Mark. 9:30-37). In this week's Gospel we have a similar situation. Two of Jesus' favorite Apostles, James and John, take Jesus off to the side and ask Him to make sure they sit at His right and left hand in the Kingdom. But Jesus can understand weakness; He patiently repeats the idea one more time that what awaits Him, and them as well, is a bath of pain. Is that what they want? Still misunderstanding the concept, the "Sons of Thunder" (Mark's nickname for them) quickly say "sure". Jesus replies they will have the pain and suffering, but their place in the Kingdom is up to His Father.

The other ten have trouble also understanding the concept of our leaders being servants; they do not govern. To follow Jesus means to follow Him in service. This means accompanying Him to His Crucifixion and death as our First Reading from Isaiah prophesied. The 53rd chapter of Isaiah is critical to the Christian understanding of Jesus as the suffering

Service is the will of the Lord! As Isaiah might say, the will of the Lord is accomplished in people who are willing to see how their experiences can better others no matter how far down the scale they have gone. Clear on the concept we "see the light in fullness of days" (Isaiah).
